	player. Skates – It is very important to ensure that hockey skates are properly fit to the player. Skates fit differently than street shores – a player may wear a skate that is 1-2 sizes smaller than their street shoes. Ill fitting skates can make the first hockey experience very uncomfortable and unpleasant for the player.

	Neck Guard – must be CSA Approved
	Hockey Helmet with full Cage – must be CSA approved. Helmets should always be purchased new - USED helmets are not recommended. Since they may be cracked, have loose fitting or missing liner pieces, or that have been subjected to a severe blow.

	Hockey Jerseys – players will be issued a team jersey once the teams are selected however they will require their own jersey to start the year.
	Hockey Tape
	Long Johns/under shirt or Under Armour – to be worn underneath the equipment
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Equipment can be purchased at a variety of sporting good stores such as Source for Sports and department stores such as Walmart and Canadian Tire. For younger players - some stores carry protective kits which often contain: Pants, Shin Pads, Elbow Pants, Shoulder Pads, Gloves and a Bag. Some Sports Stores take trade-ins on skates and offer excellent quality used skates, often in very good condition at a fraction of the price of new skates.
